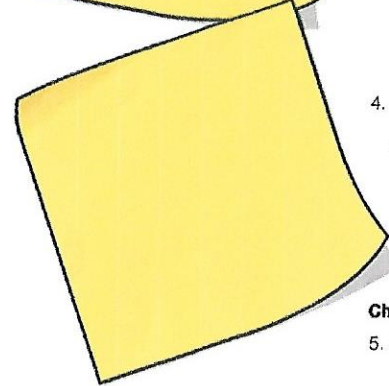
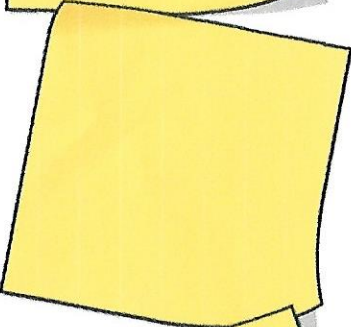
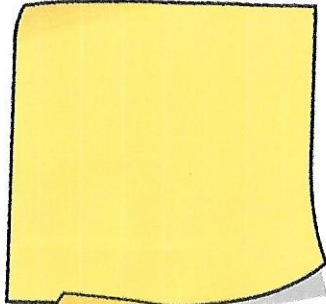

3. Just as the journalists predicted, what event happens in this chapter?

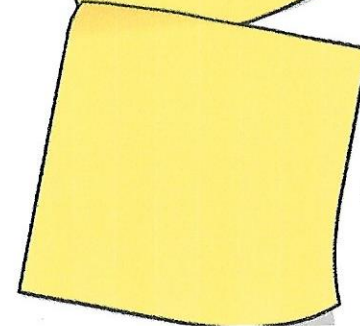
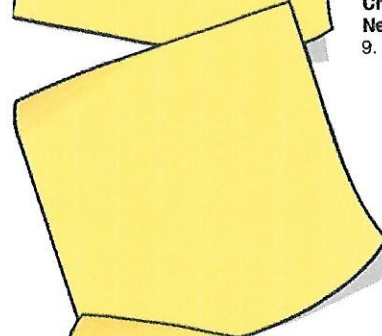
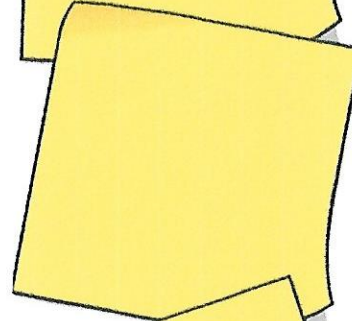
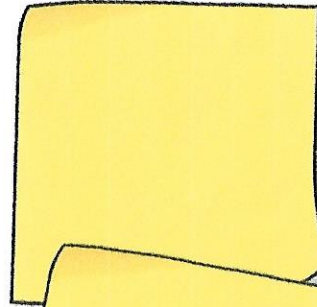
